- 03-02-08 4:36 pm Officer received a phone call from an Omaha PD Officer involving credit card fraud. Someone had stolen his credit card number and purchased items which were mailed to a residence in Cambridge. After a 12 day investigation along with the Iowa DCI and FBI, a search warrant was served on a residence on 9<sup>th</sup> St. where many items that had been purchased with stolen credit card numbers were found in the residence. A 44 year old female who lives in the residence was taken in for questioning. No charges at this time.
- 03-03-08 5:19 pm Officer was called to a residence in the apartments. There he met with a father and his 16 and 14 year old sons. The three had gotten into an altercation. After the investigation, the 16 and 14 year olds were charged with an assault and referred to Juvenile Court. Both the boys were taken to another family members residence for a time being.
- 03-05-08 2:10 pm Officer arrested a 49 year old Cambridge man for driving while revoked. He was cited and released with a court date.
- 03-07-08 10:55 pm Officer arrested a 50 year old Ames man for driving under suspension. Cited and released with a court date.
- 03-14-08 12:00 pm During the search warrant of a residence because of a different investigation, a 22 year old male was found to be in possession of marijuana and paraphernalia. Taken to jail.
- 03-18-08 9:39 am Officer took a call of two 15 year old boys shooting a .22 rifle inside the city limits. The boys were found and talked with. They stated they were out back of their house in a wooded area shooting at birds. They were advised they couldn't do that at any time and their parents would be notified. The .22 rifle was taken and parents called. No charges.

Huxley Officers made six arrests for the month. 2 for assault, 1 driving while revoked, 1 driving while suspended, 1 possession of marijuana and 1 possession for paraphernalia. Officers issued 12 citations for traffic violations and gave 16 warnings for others. Officers had 29 calls for information or assistance and a total of 94 contacts for the month. Officers had 11 hours of answering calls or giving assistance, 84.5 hours of patrol and 47 hours of furthering investigations.
