- 11-03-07 9:30 am Officer investigated a call of criminal mischief at the Hear of Iowa bike trail. It appeared that someone ran over the sign post poles that are supposed to keep people off the bike trail.
- 11-07-07 2:40 pm Officer arrested a Crest Hill, IL. Man for theft after he drove off at a gas station in Story City and did not pay for gas. Story City PD did file the charges on him.
- 11-12-07 3:05 pm Officer was called to the Kum n Go about a 14 year old Cambridge boy stealing a lighter. The boy was found later and the lighter was with him. He was charged with Theft 5<sup>th</sup>, referred to Juvenile Court and turned back over to his parents.
- 11-13-07 12:40 pm Officer was called to a 27 year old male threatening harm to himself. He was taken to MGMC for evaluation.
- 11-19-07 5:45 pm Officer arrested a 16 year old Cambridge boy for assaulting his step father. He was referred to Juvenile Court and taken to a shelter.
- 11-20-07 2:15 pm Officer took a call about 4 boys stealing alcohol from the Kum n Go. A couple of names were given and those boys were talked with and denied any involvement. The security cameras in the store showed the boys in there but did not show any clear evidence that alcohol was taken.
- 11-20-07 3:45 pm Officer took a report of a 75 year old Cambridge man, an Alzheimer's patient, finding the keys to a vehicle and driving off. Early the next morning, officers got a call that he had returned home safe and sound.
- 11-21-07 9:00 pm Officer took a call from a local bar about a person in the business and the owner wanted him out. The person was found outside the business and issued a trespass notice not to come back. Nothing further.

Huxley Officers made 3 arrests for the month. Two for theft and one for an assault. Officers issued 8 traffic citations and gave 26 warnings. Officers had 12 calls for information or assistance and a total of 77 contacts. Officers had 4.75 hours of answering calls or giving assistance and 88.75 hours of patrol time.
